Here, Sharon discusses how the Access software has improved many of their day-to-day processes.

Before implementing the Access Finance and Budgeting software we were using a finance management information system called Facility CMIS. I found this system to be unnecessarily complicated, taking several clicks to produce different reports - time that really can add up over the course of a month.

Thankfully, we had planned to introduce the Access software before lockdown was announced and despite having to undertake the implementation training from home, the majority of us could continue working as normal from home. Without this we'd have been playing a serious game of catch-up over the autumn term getting all the reports, files and records back in order.

With our new system we can produce easily-accessible reports and budget projections for our governors and other key stakeholders, giving them the ability to thoroughly analyse and challenge the school appropriately. The system has also removed the need to produce hard copy orders, therefore reducing our paper consumption, helping us move towards our aim of becoming paperless and, of course, saving money.

Invoices and delivery notes received from suppliers can be scanned and saved electronically which saves a huge amount of time, time that can be spent on strategic projects. The new software has also given performance development opportunities.



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The scenario planning feature of the Access Budgeting software has been invaluable - especially during lockdown, as it was important to monitor any increased expenditure for Covid-19 and be able to report this information to the governing board.

As my team and the other budget holders develop their knowledge of the system, I'm confident that the impact on the pupils will become more evident. The time staff spend placing orders for resources will be reduced, giving them more time to focus on the pupils and ensuring the resources bought are having a direct and positive impact.
